- The number of students achieving 5 or more A*-C passes at Churchill Community College was the highest in the Local Authority this year
- Students make good progress; targets have been met over a 3 year period and were exceeded in 2010.

Teaching & Learning

- Teaching is a particular strength of the school; the quality of teaching and learning is good. During the inspection 52 lessons were observed and the majority were found to be good or **outstanding**
- Good practice in classrooms around collaborative working and personalised feedback help students make progress
- The use of teaching assistants is a strength of the school to support student progress
- Students enjoy their learning and like the range of activities that they do in lessons
- Our Literacy work is **outstanding**
- 70% of teaching in Year 10/11 is good or **outstanding** and 77% of teaching in Sixth Form is good or **outstanding**

- Primary transition programme means that transferring pupils know the school well before they arrive, and that teachers in the family of primary schools and in the College work together to ensure that there is no dip in performance in Year 7
